

**CD41 monoclonal antibody**

BackGround:

Integrins are α/β heterodimeric cell surface receptors that play a pivotal role in cell adhesion and migration, as well as in growth and survival. The integrin family contains at least 18 α and 8 β subunits that form 24 known integrins with distinct tissue distribution and overlapping ligand specificities. Integrins not only transmit signals to cells in response to the extracellular environment (outside-in signaling), but also sense intracellular cues to alter their interaction with the extracellular environment (inside-out signaling).

Integrin $\alpha 2b$ is a cell-surface adhesion molecule that undergoes proteolytic cleavage to yield disulfide-linked heavy and light chains, which together with glycoprotein IIIb, forms a major fibrinogen receptor in activated platelets. Mutations in the corresponding ITGA2B gene can result in Glanzmann thrombasthenia, a bleeding disorder characterized by lack of platelet aggregation.

Mouse IgG1 kappa. Liquid in PBS, pH 7.3, and 0.02% sodium azide.

Purification&Purity:

The monoclonal antibody was affinity-purified from mouse antiserum by affinity-chromatography using epitope-specific immunogen and the purity is > 95% (by SDS-PAGE).

Store at 4 °C short term. Aliquot and store at -20 °C long term. Avoid freeze-thaw cycles.
